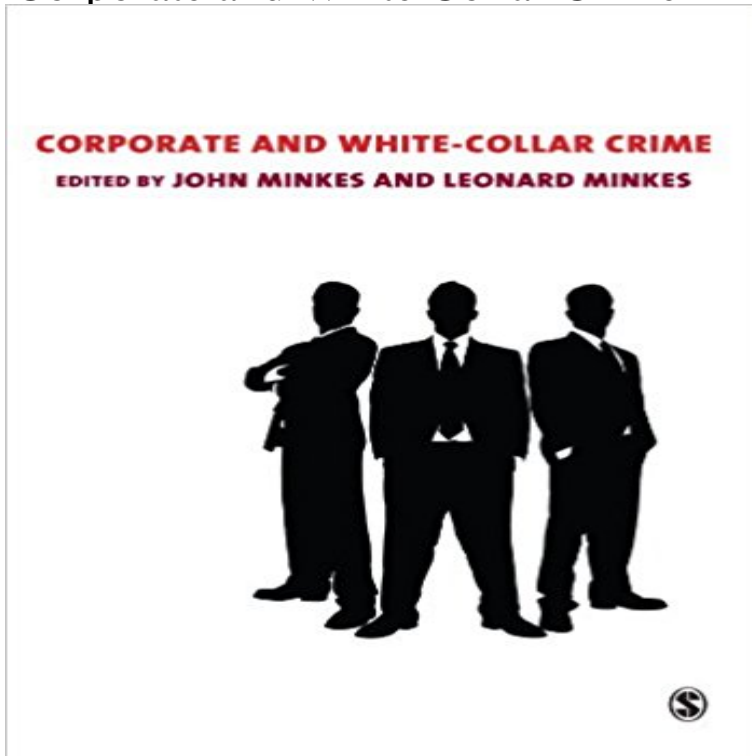


Corporate and White Collar Crime
