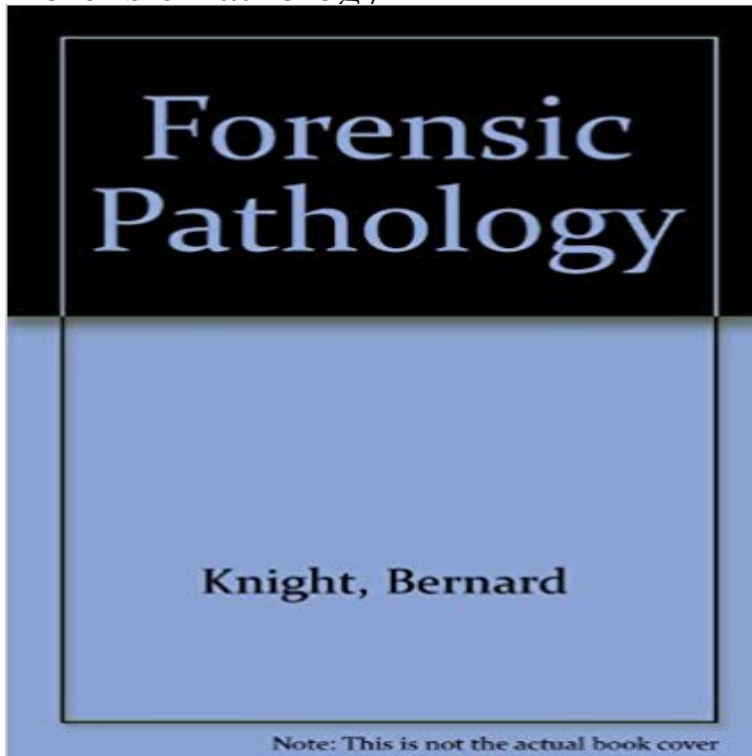


## Forensic Pathology

A helpful appendix detailing laboratory techniques and staining methods is also included.
