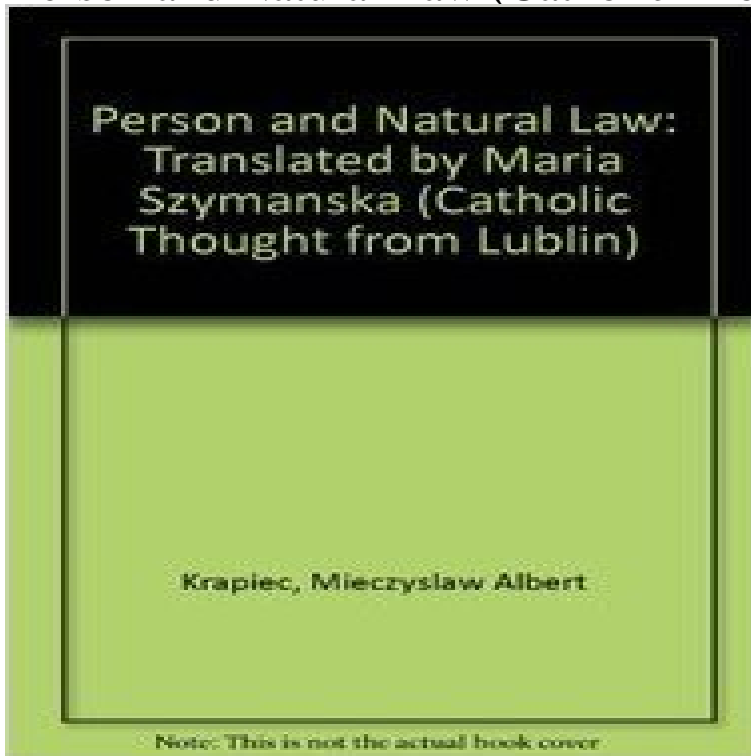


Person and Natural Law (Catholic Thought from Lublin)
