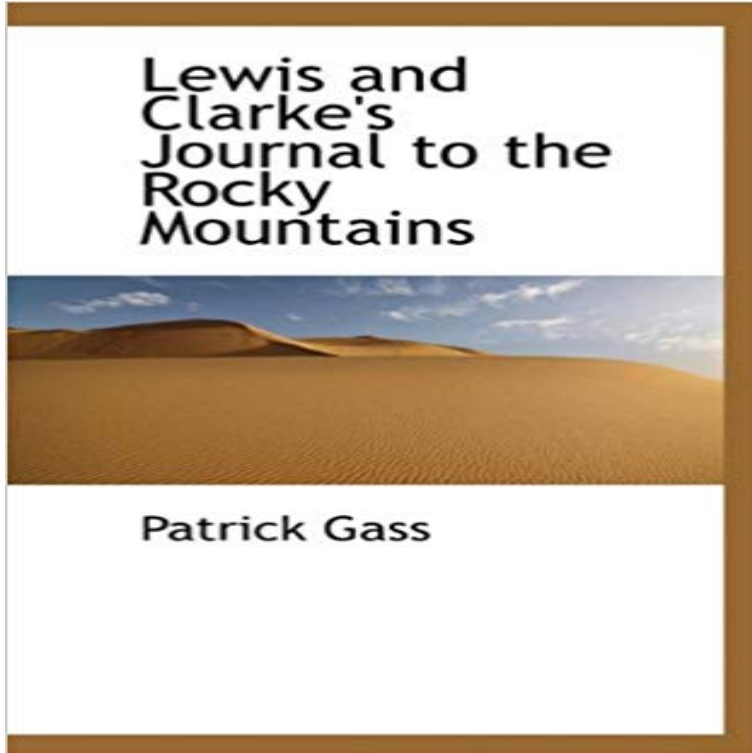


Lewis and Clarkes Journal to the Rocky Mountains
