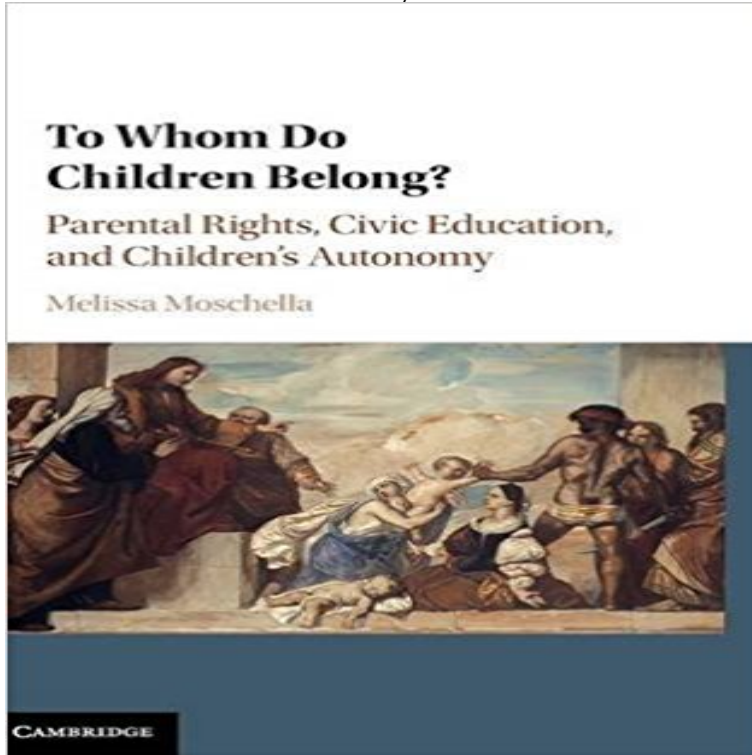


# To Whom Do Children Belong?: Parental Rights, Civic Education, and Childrens Autonomy
