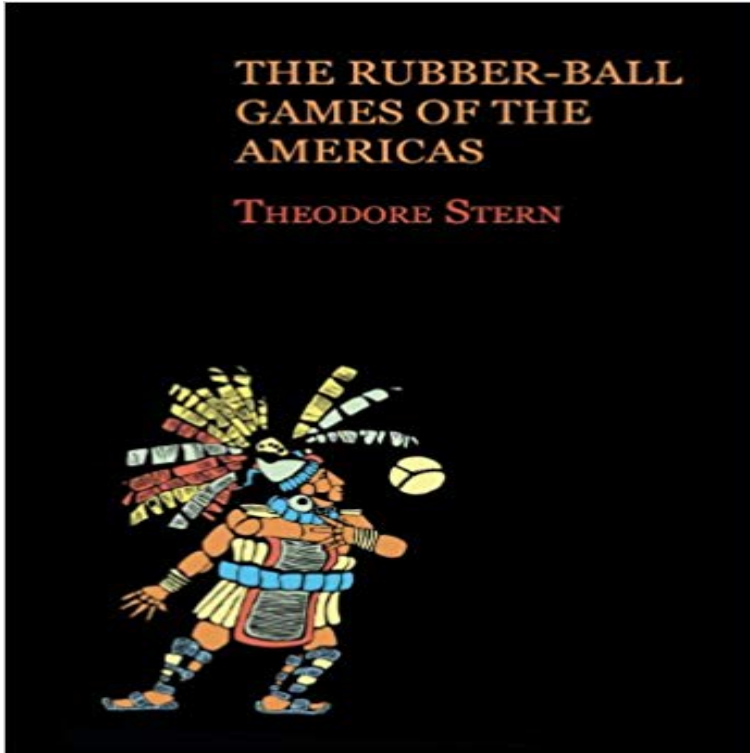


## The Rubber-Ball Games of the Americas (Reprint Edition)
