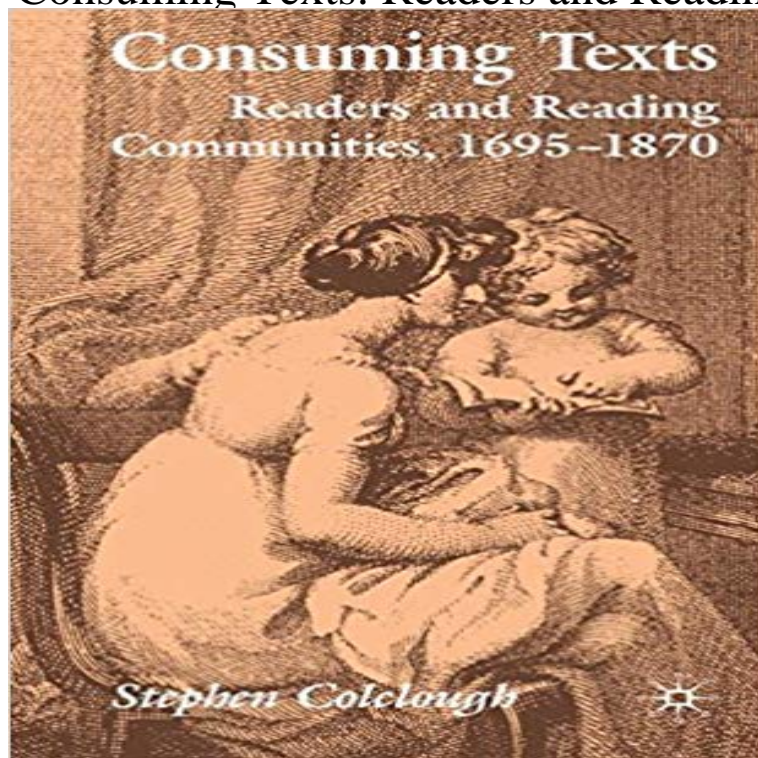


Consuming Texts: Readers and Reading Communities, 1695-1870
