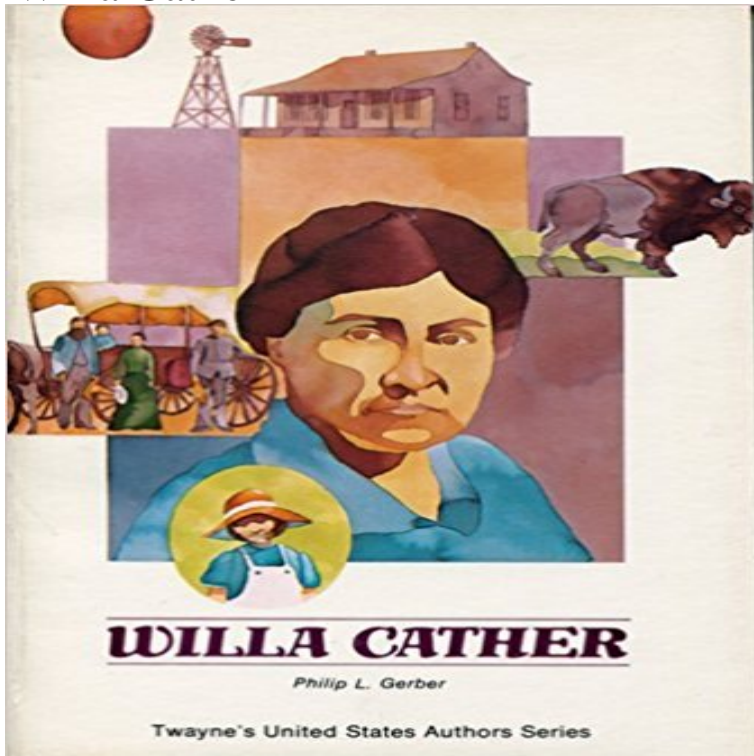


## Willa Cather
